

#### **RESOURCE #1**

#### How to Choose an Insurance Plan



The *How to Use an Insurance Plan* resource highlights several key areas to consider when selecting and then using a health insurance plan.

The following key questions are addressed:

- What are the total costs associated with a health insurance plan?
- What diabetes specific treatments or services are covered by the plan?
- Are my physicians and hospital in network?
- Does the plan offer specific programs or services that could be of value to me?
- Is there information readily available on how to submit an appeal if needed?



#### **RESOURCE #1 (CONTINUED)**

#### How to Choose an Insurance Plan

#### **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

- Understand the key components that are included in your total costs such as copays, co-insurance, and costs for devices in addition to your monthly premium
- Plan to cover any out-of-pocket costs until you've met your deductible
- Check to see what tier your insulin or pump is on and the associated costs as this will impact your overall costs
- Enroll in a plan during the Open Enrollment period. You can find that information by checking with your employer, or healthcare.gov. Enrollment may be possible outside of that period should you experience a life change event.

- Need for prior authorization

## Understanding Common Issues Around Insulin, Insulin Pumps, CGMs and Test Strips


#### **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

- Understand how your medications are covered and what tier it is on as this impacts what you will pay
- Check the plan's formulary or plan details document for this information
- Purchasing your medication at a retail location may cost more versus getting them through mail order
- Plan ahead so that you have enough supplies and insulin in case a vial breaks
- Understand any specific criteria that needs to be met before your plan will cover costs
- Make sure to understand those by looking at the durable medical equipment section in the plan documents



#### **RESOURCE #3**

#### How to Apply for an Exception



The *How to Apply for an Exception* resource highlights several key areas to consider when applying for an exception when costs or treatment aren't covered.

The following Key Questions are addressed:

- What's an exception?
- How does an exception request get submitted?

This resource also provides helpful tips for how people with T1D can work with their care team to successfully obtain an exception.



#### **RESOURCE #3 (CONTINUED)**

#### How to Apply for an Exception

#### **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

- Request an exception if your insulin, insulin pump, and CGM is not covered and before you receive treatment
- Check with your insurance company on their specific process and if there is a specific form to be completed
- Work with your doctor to complete the request and provide supplemental information or evidence like a peer-reviewed article that can support your case
- Plan ahead to cover the costs if the request is denied



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
