WHAT IS TYPE 1 DIABETES?

- T1D is an autoimmune disease in which a person's pancreas stops producing insulin, a hormone people need to get energy from food. Its onset has nothing to do with diet or lifestyle.
- People with T1D must regularly monitor their blood-sugar level, inject or continually infuse insulin through a pump, and carefully balance their insulin doses with eating and activities 24 hours a day.
- Each day, 40 children are diagnosed with T1D in the United States alone. You can support JDRF's mission by getting your school involved with the JDRF Give Back at School Program today!

AWARENESS AND FUNDRAISING IDEAS

- Have students make posters bringing awareness to type 1 diabetes, warning signs, myths vs. facts, the difference between type 1 and type 2 diabetes, and research (therapies being funded, areas of interest, etc.) and hang them up around the school.
- Have students view JDRF/type 1 diabetes educational video.
 - o Assembly JDRF staff/volunteers are available to lead assembly.
 - Show in homeroom/study hall
- Read T1D facts during morning announcements.
- Wear blue for the day to support the T1D community.
- Sporting teams wear JDRF/T1D helmet decals during game(s)
- Set a fundraising goal for the school.
- Sell JDRF Paper Sneakers
- Students donate: to wear a silly hat, receive a homework extension pass, etc.
- Hold JDRF drawings for \$1 or \$5 for a special prize. Prizes do not have to cost money, some ideas: be a principal or teacher for the day, receive a homework extension pass or an extra study hall pass.
- Hold an event where the proceeds go to JDRF:
 - Walk to End T1D Get the students, families and friends motivated to walk for health benefits while also raising funds to find a cure for T1D
 - o Talent Show or a Karaoke Contest
 - o Trivia Night for the students and their families
 - o Drawing Contest for the students and their families and friends
 - Used Book Sale Ask the school community to bring their old books
 - o Bake Contest Students can be creative and compete for the best
 - Spelling Bee Great brain-training fun for all students
 - Movie night Host a movie night on the school property (appropriate for all ages)
- Hold a celebratory walk on school grounds
- Display JDRF Paper Sneakers when they are 'sold' try to spell out "JDRF" or school's name
- Students can post a selfie to the school's social media when they purchase a JDRF Paper sneaker
- If the school reaches their goal:
 - Have Principal/teacher get a pie in the face from classroom that raised the most
 - Wear silly hats for a week/day
 - Students can receive incentive prizes based on amount they raised: JDRF bracelets, t-shirts, etc.
